
NEW BUILDING BLOCKS 1 – year 1

A HUNGRY CATERPILLAR / THE COLOUR SONG

Don't you just love the story about a hungry caterpillar?

Its ability to change colours after each meal thrills my students every time (and me, as well:).



Therefore, we decided to make our own hungry caterpillar out of collage paper. Immediately we started sharing our thoughts on what kind of foods the hungry caterpillar must have eaten.

Instead of using just monochrome colours, you can also cut out the circles that represent your hungry caterpillar out of a magazine — you'll see there'll be no end to speculation what the hungry caterpillar

ate...



You can also take a closer look at what your students are wearing and ask them if their clothes changed colours after they ate something. Vice versa, they can take a look at you and try guessing what you had for breakfast or lunch. It's fun and you'll all enjoy it!



This is a great way of revising the familiar vocabulary (colours, food, feelings...) as well as "like/don't like" structure.... and at the end of the day, (after listing all the food there possible is) you'll probably end up saying just like your caterpillar – "I'm hungry, very hungry!"
