Procedure	Lead-in: Teacher shows students a funny job interview video by BBC One about the first job interview in history (see under References). Students make comments.  A Students discuss different jobs.  B Students read a job interview and do follow-up tasks C-E.  F Students read about the rules of successful job interviews and discuss the dos and don'ts. They contribute their own ideas. Teacher shows the students the You Tube video <i>Interview dos and don'ts</i> and perhaps some other (funny) job interview videos.
