
THE UNITED KINGDOM

1 Read about the countries in the UK and look at the map. Write the names of the countries and their capitals.



- England is the largest country in the UK. It is located in the south. People who live in England are called the English. The capital city of England is London. It is also the capital city of the UK, and its largest city, too. It lies on the river Thames. There are many famous places, buildings and things in England. Some of them are: the universities of Oxford and Cambridge, Big Ben, the Tower of London, red double-decker buses and black London cabs. When the Queen is in London, she lives in Buckingham Palace. Do you know the Queen's name?
- Wales is situated in the west of the UK. People who live in Wales are called the Welsh. Besides English, 20% of the Welsh speak Welsh, or as they call it, Cymraeg. It is a Celtic language that children learn in school. The largest city and the capital of Wales is Cardiff. Wales has a beautiful landscape with many mountains. It is often called the Land of Castles because there are more castles in Wales than in any other country in Europe. Have you ever been to a castle?
- B Scotland is situated in the north. Its capital city is Edinburgh and its largest city is Glasgow. People who live in Scotland are called the Scots. They speak English, but also Scotlish Gaelic and the Scots language. Scotland is famous for its many beautiful mountains and lakes. The highest mountain is called Ben Nevis. It is 1345 metres high. The largest lake is Loch Lomond (loch lake). But the most famous lake is Loch Ness. People believe that a monster called Nessie lives there. What do you think?
- Northern Ireland is the smallest UK country. It is located in the northeast of the island of Ireland. Ireland is often called the Emerald Isle because of its beautiful, green countryside. Belfast is the capital of Northern Ireland and the second largest city on the island. The famous ship Titanic was built there. People who live in Northern Ireland are called the Irish. Languages spoken in Northern Ireland are English, Irish Gaelic and Ulster Scots. Have you ever heard the Irish language?
